Society of St Vincent de Paul Christmas Appeal 2020

St Brigid's Conference extends sincere thanks to all in the Parish who contributed so generously to this year's Christmas Collection and Toy Appeal. The total amount collected in the period prior to the 2-week lockdown and from 13th December 2020 was **£27,000**, of this **£960 came from Christmas Cards** with **£11,000 eligible for Gift Aid**.

Your generous response to the toy appeal meant we were able to help **85 families, including 185 children**.

We also provided vouchers for warm clothing, help with buying extra food and fuel. All of this was greatly received.

We also extend a special thanks to **St Brigid's GAA** who through their "**Raffle**" donated Smyth vouchers to the value of **£1500** which was given to parents to buy toys for their children. A further £790 in cash was donated and is included in the figures above.

As I am sure you know the continuing lockdowns are causing more and more hardship, so your generosity is really appreciated and is vital to our work in the SVP.

4 Corners Festival Belfast

This inter-denominational arts festival aimed at promoting reconciliation runs from **January 31 to February 7**.

Because of the pandemic it is a purely on-line project with all events being available in the comfort of your home via "live" video streaming services such as Facebook and YouTube.

The theme is Breathe... The Hebrew word Ruach means 'breath' or 'spirit' – the source of life. And the festival aims to breathe hope and creativity into Belfast and further afield at a very difficult time.

The keynote speaker is Prof John Paul Lederach, the internationally renowned author and conflict transformation expert from the University of Notre Dame in the United States.

Morning and Night Prayer will be streamed throughout the festival. Night Prayer will be led by Jim Deeds, a pastoral worker in Down and Connor and his colleague, Paula McKeown, director of the diocesan Living Church Office will facilitate a workshop on resilience.

There will be discussions on topics such as domestic abuse and racism and one of the moderators will be Seamus McKee.
